

Later in the year she will perform in Random Things Productions, 'Flirting With the Surreal - An Encounter With Pat Ingoldsby', a show bringing Pat's poems to life. She has also been cast as Caroline McGovern in Joseph Fuller's feature film 'First Time With Ghosts'. From 2012-2014 Mary Pat did training in the Michael advanced Chekhov Technique with Joerg Andres, with the intention to facilitate this work but the pull and love of acting was too strong. Since then, she has been acting at every opportunity. She has an MA in Modern Drama from UCD and a Diploma in Theatre Studies from NUI Maynooth.



Kieran has been involved with SHOULD I STAY OR SHOULD I GO? since it's earliest inception, from its first performance in Smock Alley's Scene and Heard to its 2019 run in the Teacher's Club. He is delighted to be involved in bringing the work back home to where it first was given life.

Kieran worked for many years with Frank Allen's Tobar na Run, and featured in many productions including; 'Down the Flats', 'Making it Home', 'Oh When the Hoops', 'Hatchet', 'Seven Lives for Liberty' and 'Mr. Blueberry'. He has received critical acclaim for his role as Sean Mallon in 'Going Home' and as Mikey in 'Abused Together'.

He was a founding member of Raising Issues Theatre Group and worked with Patricia McCann on a number of her community theatre productions including '2BHIVOY', 'Are You For Real', and 'Gold Folks'.

Kieran's mission has always been to make theatre accessible for those who are excluded, and worked with community groups, writing and directing 'Bone Dry' and 'Cherish our Children', which were performed in the Teachers Club, to facilitate them in taking to the stage.

He has worked as a director with emerging playwright Eddie Naughton on 'Franner and Joey' and 'The Boy with the Halogen Hair' for Knot On Productions, and is working to bring the third in the trilogy, 'The Trouble with Bobo', to stage in the near future.

Or really big ones like, does she have enough polo mints to get through the day? 'Should I Stat or Should I Go?' is the result of those questions
